I put my doubts down in an article -published here as the Prologue - and circulated it to some people I knew who worked in what I recognised as an existential fashion. Some of these refused to answer at length, merely making some incidental comments, which I still felt it worthwhile to publish here because of their intrinsic interest.

But some of the replies were so excellent and so very much worth considering that it looked as if a special issue of Self and Society would come together around this material. The present issue is the result of that process.
