There were some key issues arising from the AGM which the Board has given some attention to during the past two months. First, a closer relationship with members. As from the AGM, five members of the Board resigned after some years - Josefine Speyer, who helped to run the last conference; Sally Hart, who has been and will continue to serve on the Ethics Committtee: Brenda Rogers, who has done so much in acting on behalf of Counsellor members and been a liaison with BAC so that we might be included in the new Register; Michael Preisinger, who has been our Treasurer: and Ulrike Encke, who has been Vice-Chair and General Secretary as well dealing with complaints prior to the appointment of an Ethics Officer. I am aware of the big loss they represent. Collectively they have put in an enormous amount of work for the Association over the years and we will miss their contributions. Thank you all for the time and energy you have given.
