

A Further instalment of 'The Big Issue' – the proposed separation of AHPP and its consequences.

The joint working party met on Sunday 6th February. After the clearing of feelings and the clarifying of intent, the main points established:

- a)** there were no legal constraints concerning the constitution to prevent AHPP going ahead with separation (We're leaving home. Bye! Bye!)
- b)** the position be checked with the Charities Commission
- c)** a close liaison between the two organisations be sought and formalised
- d)** the safeguarding of the position of Self & Society be proposed.

Much of the time was taken up in considering the details of financial arrangements, membership and subscription categories and organisational membership, out of which proposals will be taken back to each committee.

An air of optimistic resolution was detected by the end of the meeting.

Tasks for AHP

- ← Over 75% of members/subscribers are not in AHPP, consider further how to develop a more active membership.
- ← Seeking new membership groups: higher education offers a potential pool of interested members. Do we have members willing to make personal contacts through our work or connections?
- ← Using the festival on 6th May to publicise our work.
